

Future Trends Report
Based on Analysis of the Future Scene in Mid-Term and Final Evaluation

STEP 1. Identify Challenges

Read the Future Scene carefully and generate ideas for challenges, concerns, and possible related problems. Choose the 5 most important challenges and write them in the space provided. Include applicable research with appropriate in-text citations.

Challenge #1:

Given that there would be an increase in taxes and escalating health costs in 2050 (FACT), the general population would face rising costs of living (INFERRED PROBLEM), leading to an increased sense of dissatisfaction and unhappiness with the government amongst the people(LARGER CONSEQUENCE).

Challenge #2: Given that the youths do not spend much time with the elderly, who do not seem bothered by being left alone (FACT), they might not want to have much contact or communication with anyone (INFERRED PROBLEM), leading to poor mental or emotional health like dementia and depression (LARGER CONSEQUENCE).

Challenge #3: Given that the elderly are heavily reliant on the use of technology and are not motivated enough to engage in activities at the elderly care centres (FACT), it might lead to the elderly having not much physical exercise, thus affecting their physical health (INFERRED PROBLEM). This might result in an unhealthy population of elderly people who might strain the health system further (LARGER CONSEQUENCE).

Challenge #4: Given that the elderly are not getting as much attention from the government compared to the youths, this may lead to them feeling unwanted and useless, possibly leading to depression.

Challenge #5: Given that most of the elderly are unable to complete household chores due to them being medically restricted, they have to rely on technological gadgets. The elderly might not know how to use more complicated technology, leading to the household chores being undone, resulting in poorer living conditions.

Underlying Problem: Given the inference we have made, the elderly in 2050 are likely to suffer from the potential problems of poor mental and physical health as well as the working population's unhappiness with the high costs of living (CONDITION PHRASE), how might we improve the mental and physical health of the elderly (KEY VERB PHRASE) so that they will not put extra strain on the working population (PURPOSE) in Singapore in 2050 and beyond (FUTURE SCENE PARAMETERS).

STEP 3. Produce Solution Ideas

Generate solution ideas to the Underlying Problem in Step 2. Choose the 5 most effective solutions and write the elaborated ideas in the space provided. . Include applicable research with appropriate in-text citations.

Solution #1: The Elderwatch Centre (WHO) would promote a TakeAPet Home activity whereby elderly folks can adopt a pet of their choice from the Animal Shelter (WHAT) Through taking care of the pets, the elderly will be able to be more engaged and less lonely or depressed, thereby improving their mental health. (HOW)

Solution #2: The Keep Fit Association (WHO) would promote healthy living by coming up with initiatives related to physical exercises and healthy eating. This would in the form of advertisements or campaigns that will be broadcast during commercial breaks. (WHAT) This ensures that the elderly would get up and engage in simple stretching exercises as well as being introduced healthy diets while enjoying their daily dose of drama. (HOW)

Solution #3: The Media Broadcasting Company (MBC) (WHO) would organise studio and games related to TV dramas that are popular with the elderly (WHAT). This will bring the elderly who are interested in the dramas together so that they interact with one another and make more friends. Prizes and cash vouchers would be offered to the elderly participants to keep their minds and bodies alert, thus improving their mental and physical health (HOW).

Solution #4: The government (WHO) could improve facilities used by the elderly like the hospitals, elderly care centres and clinics (WHAT), making the elderly feel that the elderly care centres have special facilities and are “elderly-friendly”. This is to ensure that the elderly are using the better quality facilities, attracting them to use the facilities and keeping themselves physically fit (HOW).

Solution #5: Robots called the Smart Shopper Companions (WHO) would be stationed at all convenience stores and supermarkets (WHAT) to guide elderly shoppers on how to choose food that are more healthy and nutritious. They will also share simple recipes for cooking healthy meals and samples of such meals will be available tasting at the customer service counters (HOW).

The robots known as smart shoppers will be stationed at supermarkets and grocery stores to guide customers to choose their food products and cooking methods wisely in order to lead a healthy and balanced diet. This therefore urges more people who frequent the grocery stores to be alert of the better choices of food products they can make. Research have shown that most people living in America consume less vegetables, fruits, whole-grains and dairy products while 90% of the Americans have intakes of sodium which are much more than the recommended amount.
